



Wyoming State Parks and Historic Sites Passport Program Site Instructions

We are excited to start a great new program! The State Parks and Historic Site Passport Program is ready for 2021! This packet will give you all the information and supplies you need to get this program under way.

What is the State Parks and Historic Site Passport Program?

The passport program will educate and inform the public about Wyoming State Parks and Historic Sites. The purpose of the passport program is to increase awareness of our sites and provide a centralized book with information about each of the state parks and historic sites. The public can obtain a passport book from our sites and visit other parks and historic sites to stamp their book.

How does the program work?

Each park and historic site will receive passport books, site stamp, stickers and an email file with flyers. When a visitor asks for a passport book, they are given one. (Make sure to stamp their book for your site!) The visitor can then go to different parks/historic sites and collect the stamps for each park/historic site.

How to participate

Prizes

Complete an entire district and get a State Parks sticker
Collect all 37 stamps and get an Annual Day Use Pass for the next calendar year

Redeem Prizes

Did you complete a district?

Pick up your sticker at participating parks/historic sites

Did you complete the passport book?

Pick up your certificate of completion at participating parks/historic sites

How do you get your Annual Day Use Pass?

Redeem your code and instructions will be emailed to you

Rules

One passport book per family/person per calendar year
Annual Day Use Pass available per family/person per calendar year

Employees, volunteers, and immediate family of Wyoming State Parks Employees are ineligible for the prize incentives
